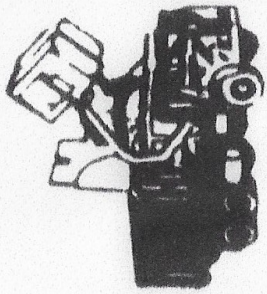

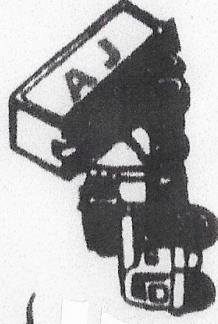
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## JUNIOR BAKING CONTEST - 2019 PUMPKIN APPLE CRUMB MUFFINS

### Muffin Ingredients

1 ½ cups King Arthur Flour all-purpose flour  
1 1/8 cups white sugar  
2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice  
¾ teaspoon baking soda  
¼ teaspoon salt  
1 cup (8 oz) 100% pure pumpkin  
2 eggs  
2 tablespoons canola oil  
1 small apple (Macintosh) peeled, cored and finely chopped

### Crumb Top Ingredients

1/8 cup white sugar  
¼ teaspoon ground cinnamon  
1 tablespoon butter

### Directions

Preheat oven to 350 Degrees.  
Place 12 paper baking cups in muffin tin.  
Combine flour, sugar, pumpkin pie spice, baking soda and salt in large bowl.  
Combine pumpkin, eggs, oil and apple in medium bowl and mix well. Stir into flour mixture just until moistened.  
Fill baking/muffin cups 3/4 full.  
Crumb Top — Combine sugar, flour and cinnamon in medium bowl. Cut in butter with pastry blender or fork until crumbly.  
Sprinkle over top of muffins.  
Bake for 30 minutes or until tested with toothpick and it comes out clean.  
Cool in pan for 5 minutes, remove to wire racks to cool.

Submit six muffins on a white paper plate.

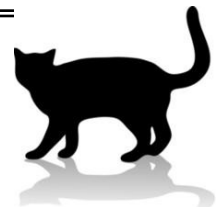

1. The Cheshire Grange Community Fair Entry Blank (enclosed) must be completed and returned to the Secretary no later than Monday, August 19th.
  2. The Cheshire Grange Community Fair will endeavor to protect all exhibits, but will not be responsible for loss or damage. A qualified person will be on hand at all times to watch and supervise the exhibits.
  3. Please see individual Departments for special rules and for times exhibits will be accepted.
  4. No exhibits may be removed from the Fair before 5:00 p.m. Sunday, but all must be removed by 6:00 p.m. Any exhibits removed before 5:00 p.m. will not be awarded premium money.
  5. Each article will be judged by its own merits. Agricultural exhibits must be grown by the Exhibitor.
  6. No article may be exhibited in more than one lot.
  7. Articles may be reclassified if deemed necessary by the Superintendent.
  8. The Fair reserves the right to prorate premiums.
  9. Articles which have been previously exhibited at the Cheshire Grange Community Fair should not be exhibited again except for Collections which have been added to since they were last exhibited.
  10. Competent Judges will be secured. Any person interfering with a Judge while executing his duties will be excluded from competition.
  11. Premiums will be paid as soon after the Fair as possible. If any exhibitor fails to receive their premiums by December 1<sup>st</sup>, they should notify the Secretary. Youth Premiums will be paid at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday.
  12. Entry Fee for Adult Exhibitors will be \$1.00 per person for as many items as they wish to enter.
  13. Entry Fee for Youth Exhibitors entering Dept. Y only is 25 cents per person for as many items as they wish to enter. All others must pay the \$1.00 entry fee.
  14. Admission to the Cheshire Grange Community Fair is FREE.
  15. Exhibitors must have the written permission of the Department Superintendent to sell their exhibits. The Fair will receive a 5% Commission on all items sold. Nothing may leave before 5:00 p.m. Sunday.
  16. All Ribbons must be claimed. None will be mailed.
  17. Entry Blanks can be found in the center fold. Official entry blank must be used. Photostatic copies will be accepted. Additional blanks are available from the Secretary.

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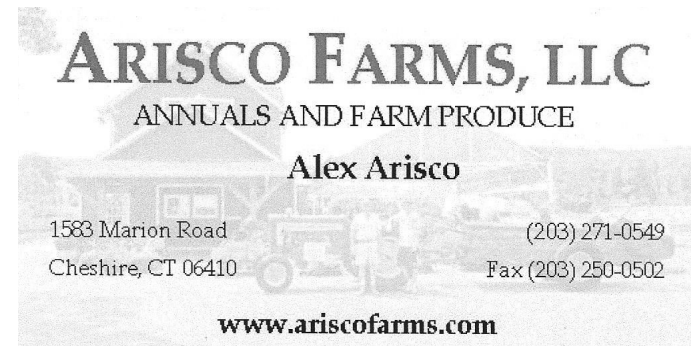

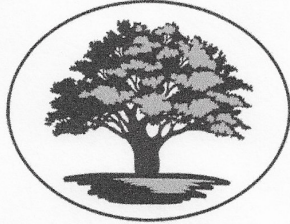

**WHO MAY ENTER:** The contest at each participating member fair is open to all men, women and juniors who are residents of Connecticut. Commercial, industrial or professional bakers are not eligible. Divisions: Juniors (ages 7 to 15 as of July 1st) and

**HOW TO ENTER:** Any Connecticut resident entering a contest at any participating member fair is automatically entered and competing in the local contest. Contestants may enter the contest at as many fairs as they wish until they win first prize. They will then represent that fair at the state baking contest. Please submit entries to both the local and state contest on disposable plates. The Association of Connecticut Fairs and the member fairs are not responsible for the return of plates, trays or con-

**JUDGING:** Judging will be based on appearance, flavor and texture. The Association of Connecticut Fairs will furnish judges' score sheets to each fair and the contestant will receive these sheets at the end of the contest. Additions, deletions or substitutions in the recipe are not permitted and will result in disqualification. All decisions of

**LOCAL CONTEST:** The winner of the local contest will receive a blue ribbon from the Association of Connecticut Fairs and will then become eligible to submit their entry at the state contest. In the event that only one entry is received at the local contest and that entry is worthy of first prize, that entry must be awarded the first place ribbon.

**STATE CONTEST:** The state contest is held as part of the Fall Meeting and Convention of the Association of Connecticut Fairs. Entries for the state contest are accepted until 11:00 a.m. on the day of the judging (contact your local fair or visit [www.ctagfairs.org](http://www.ctagfairs.org) for the date and location). Contest winners are announced at the Fall Meeting. Each fair is responsible for contacting their contest winner and providing them with information. ## Adult Baking Contest - 2019

### Cinnamon Star Bread



#### Dough

- 2 cups King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour
- 1/2 cup instant mashed potato flakes
- 1/4 cup nonfat dry milk
- 3/4 cup + 2 to 4 tablespoons lukewarm water, enough to make a soft, smooth dough
- 1/4 cup (4 tablespoons) unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 teaspoons instant yeast
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt

#### Filling

- 1 large egg, beaten
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon

#### Instructions

1. First, measure the flour by gently spooning it into a cup, then sweeping off any excess. Sift the flour and dry milk. Add the potato flakes.
2. To make the dough: Combine all of the dough ingredients and mix and knead to make a soft, smooth dough.

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**Don't Like Pie?**

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3. Place the dough in a lightly greased bowl, cover, and let it rise for 60 minutes, until it's nearly doubled in bulk.
4. Divide the dough into four equal pieces. Shape each piece into a ball, cover the balls, and allow them to rest for 15 minutes.
5. On a lightly greased or floured work surface, roll one piece of dough into a 10" circle. Place the circle on a piece of parchment, brush a thin coat of beaten egg on the surface, then evenly sprinkle with 1/3 of the cinnamon-sugar, leaving 1/4" of bare dough around the perimeter.
6. Roll out a second circle the same size as the first and place it on top of the filling-covered circle. Repeat the layering process — egg, cinnamon sugar, dough circle — leaving the top circle bare.
7. Place a 2 1/2" to 3" round cutter in the center of the dough circle as a guide. With a bench knife or sharp knife, cut the circle into 16 equal strips, from the cutter to the edge, through all the layers.
8. Using two hands, pick up two adjacent strips and twist them away from each other twice so that the top side is facing up again. Repeat with the remaining strips of dough so that you end up with eight pairs of strips.
9. Pinch the pairs of strips together to create a star-like shape with eight points. Remove the cutter.
10. Transfer the star on the parchment to a baking sheet. Cover the star and let it rise until it becomes noticeably puffy, about 45 minutes.
11. While the star is rising, preheat the oven to 400°F.
12. Brush the star with a thin coat of the beaten egg. Bake it for 12 to 15 minutes, until it's nicely golden with dark brown cinnamon streaks; the center should register 200°F on a digital thermometer.
13. Remove the loaf from the oven and allow it to cool for about 10 minutes.

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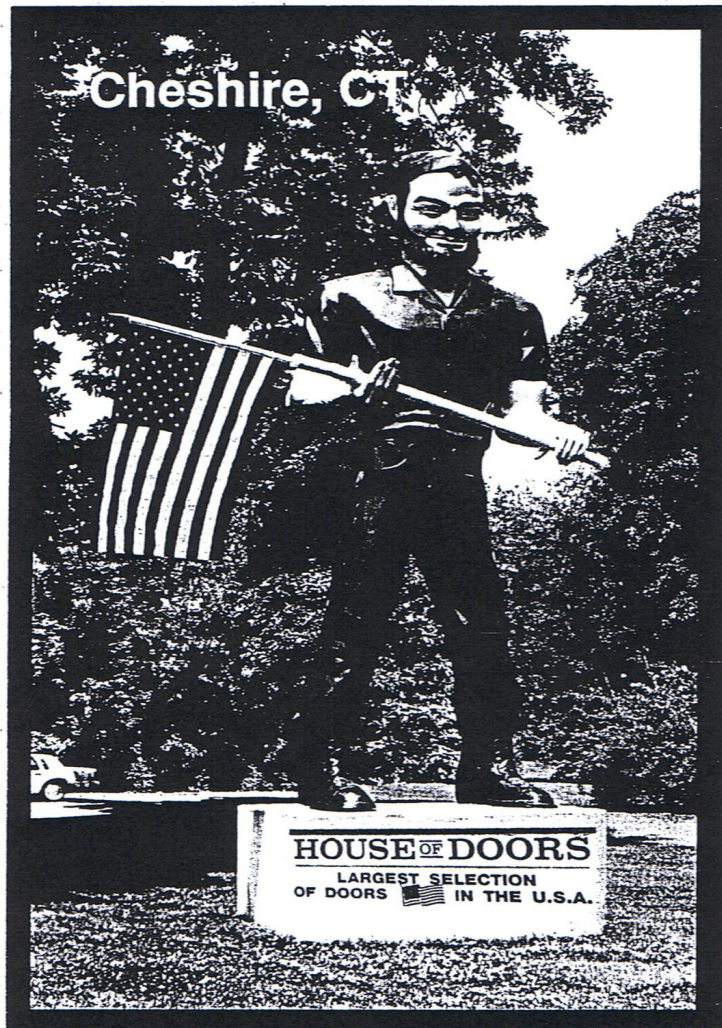

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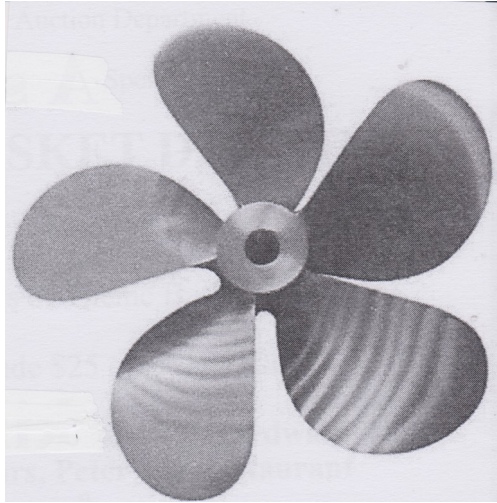

6. All pies become the property of the Association of Connecticut Fairs (baking dishes will not be returned).

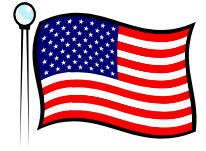
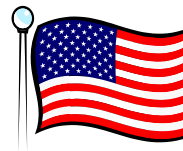

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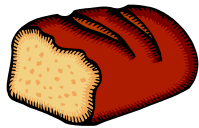
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
